WeParentUHelp: Ok: What is the time frame for when freshman students start looking for off-campus housing? When are leases normally signed?

familychatadministrator(Arie_NewStudent&FamilyPrograms): Students will start looking in November/December but we recommend that students make a decision byMarch.It will all depend on where your student is interested in living. The more popular locations that are close to campus will start to fill up soon. However, there are more apartments in Gainesville than there are residents to fill them, so there will always be a place to live, but it will depend on what your student is looking for. One thing to keep in mind is that many apartment complexes will try to pressure students to sign the day that they tour by giving monetary incentives. I recommend that your student does their research and narrows it down to a few to tour. Set up tours on the same day so that they can compare and make a decision if they are

WeParentUHelp: Thanks for the advice, I'll tell my student to start looking into it. He knows he wants a parking spot rather than fighting for one or risking tickets/towing. So that's a place to start, I guess.

familychatadministrator(Arie_NewStudent&FamilyPrograms): That is a good place to start!

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): AlliD, Flexible Learning is not tied to a term (that is, students can start and end at other times) and so it appears differently. From what I understand, students can get financial aid for flex learning courses (though it's usually a reimbursement). Your student should talk to Student Financial

AlliD: Yes, I apologize, I mis labeled the program - the application form is Distance and Continuing Education and the link to apply is to Flexible Learning

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): AlliD, students are typically only referred to flex learning if there is no way to take the UF course. What course(s) is your student planning on taking?

AlliD: We are out of state and pay full tuition. Just wondered why it didn't apply to his total tuition and had to be paid separately. My concern was really more the academics of the class.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): AlliD, the content should be basically the same.

Msmudpuppy: Lynn, do online classes count towards the summer credit requirements that each student must familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): AlliD, if you let me know which class(es), I can see if, in fact, there are no seats on campus.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Msmudpuppy, online courses taken through UF in the summer will meet the 9 credit State Summer Term Enrollment requirement.

dan@gdanielgreen.com: Is there a student tutoring group on campus. I know of Study Edge, which is a commercial operation, just curious as to options for campus based sources for my freshman son, just in

Unilife: Do you recommend to be enroll in summer too?

Msmudpuppy: We live out of state so if my son takes a class online this summer, he can do so at home during the summer and the course would count toward the 9 credit requirement. I this correct?

Mokie2017: Hello and Happy New Year. About the summer required credits. I believe Bright futures will pay this summer. But if that changes and they don¿t pay for summer credits in the future, then can the student be exempt from the summer credit requirements? That is what happened for my daughter at FSU who graduated dan@gdanielgreen.com: Thanks, very helpful!

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Msmudpuppy, Yes, if your student takes a UF class online over summer, that would count toward the Summer Requirement.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Goody, I'm not sure what college Collegiate High School is affiliated with, but UF accepts a maximum of 60 credits from Community and State Colleges in Florida. However, all the credits will post with grades on the UF transcript, it's just your student will only apply 60 to the UF degree. As far as GPAs, UF calculates a UFGPA, not including transfer work. Students can calculate their own 'all-college' GPA and often do if they are applying to graduate or professional schools after finishing at UF.

Gboyisagator: My son had a very good first semester and is now considering applying for the honors college. Can he do that as a sophomore, and will that require any additional classes?

Turtleseagirl: What's the deadline for registering for summer semester? Our son is looking at a study abroad program. If he doesn't do that and if online classes satisfy the summer requirement, I want to be sure he gets registered while we have Bright Futures for sure this summer.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Mokie, the State hasn't had Bright Futures pay for summer in many, many years. But the State regulation that students complete 9 credits in the Summer still remains. There are ways to petition it.https://registrar.ufl.edu/pdf/summer_enrollment_waiver.pdf You can see if your student may qualify to have it waived. Keep in mind students must have 75 credits earned to petition the Summer familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Gboy...Here's the link to information about applying for the Honors program after your first year:http://www.honors.ufl.edu/prospective/admissions/university-honors-

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Turtle...Registration for both Summer and Fall will begin in mid- to late-

Gboyisagator: Thank you

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): dan@gd and Gboy, you're welcome.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): All, did I miss anyone's question?

Goody: In regards to Bright futures and summer semester, can you please tell us what the required course load is, as we had read it was 6 credits.

Turtleseagirl: Gosh, I thought tuition was covered at 100% for the highest Bright Future level this year...

Unilife: when and is it recomended for student to do summer session? Sorry first time in college...

Mokie2017: Thank you. Yes, my daughter had to wait till Senior year to be able to petition to waive the summer credit requirement due to Bright futures not paying for summer. I just didn¿t know if that was unique to FSU or if it applied to all FL schools.

Turtleseagirl: (for summer term as well as fall and spring)

kuiltmom@gmail.com: When are we able to see the courses offered for summer session? My daughter's Spanish teacher last semester recommended she take Spanish II at home this summer. Her adviser approved it. She should have taken it this semester so as to not have a gap between the two classes which is important for foreign languages. Also, I would much rather have this class count as part of her 9 credits of summer classes,

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Goody, This is the ONLY summer for many years that BF is paying for Summer courses...I believe BF funds in summer on the basis of the number of credits taken, but truthfully, it's been so long since this happened, I can't be sure. I'd check with Student Financial Affairs in S107 Criser as they are the Financial Aid and Scholarship experts.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Turtle, BF (I think Academic Scholar) is supposed to pay for Summer courses this year. Again, I'd check with Student Financial Affairs for details.

kuiltmom@gmail.com: Lynn, would BF cover online courses for summer credits or only on campuses courses?

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Unilife, no worries :-) So the State of Florida requires that students take 9 credits in the Summer at one of the 11 State University System schools in Florida. Your student can do that in any of the summer's he/she is attending. In fact, many students spread it out, take one course online in one summer, do an internship for credit in another, and so on. But we expect this year since Bright Futures is paying, that more students will enroll both at UF and other other State Universities.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Mokie, if your student can demonstrate one of the reasons on the petition, it can be waived.

smct4: If my daughter wants to change her major and the major is in a different college, which college should she go to to change it?

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): kuiltmom...Summer course schedules (and Fall course schedules) will be available at the end of February or very beginning of March.

kuiltmom@gmail.com: Thank you Lynn.....my second question already answered

Msmudpuppy: Just so I'm clear on the summer credit requirement, I'm assuming that if my son enrolls in an online UF class this summer, he does not need to live on campus and can take the online class from our home

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Kuiltmom, if she takes it at home but through at State University, it would meet the Summer Requirement... not sure where you are, but that's an option.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): smct, what major does your student want to enter?

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): kuiltmom, State Colleges are not SUS schools. UWF would work, or an online version of SPN1131. Also, drop/add is not over for spring, your student may yet get a seat in SPN1131.

smct4: She is in the college of liberal arts and sciences and she wants to change to APK.

dubco1: Our out of state students expected to do the 9 summer credits

kuiltmom@gmail.com: Thank you Lynn. She has not intention of taking it this semester as she is following the guidance of her professor and adviser and not her parents. :-/

dubco1: Are*

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): smct4, she'd go to the College of Health and Human Performance.

Mokie2017: Thank you. And I have the same Q, will BF pay for online UF summer courses this summer or only Turtleseagirl: Any word yet when we might find out from Florida legislatures about the Bright Futures awards going forward into Fall 2018? Thanks.

Unilife: For summer credit requirement... any class is accepted or there is a requirement list?

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): dubco1, yes, it's a State of Florida regulation for all University students. Your student can do online courses via UF, or do internships at home and get credit, or do overseas study, so your student doesn't necessarily need to be in Gainesville.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): kuiltmom, the professor/advisor may have good reasons based on her other coursework.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Mokie, UF courses are UF courses whether online or in-class. The only courses treated differently are the flexible learning courses. Basically, if your student can add it via UF's registration system, it's a regular UF course.

Turtleseagirl: Regarding summer internships being approved for the summer credit (that's exciting news!), is there a process for finding out in advance which internships would qualify?

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Turtle, since last year the Governor vetoed SB4 but not the budget and that all happened in mid-June, I'd guess we won't know much for sure until mid- to late June.

familychatmoderator(Lynn_Advisor): Unilife, any college credit course taken at UF or another State University in Florida.

kuiltmom@gmail.com: Lynn, thank you very much for your advising. You are outstanding here and on Facebook. Please know that our family really appreciates you and the other folks who seem to be available
